

## How to Apply

Submit a pre-application form which is available from the Trust's web-site or contact the Trust Project Officer.

A minimum of three quotations are needed along with a completed application form and supporting information. Grant offers are made by letter and contain conditions of award that must be accepted.

Work that is started before an offer of a grant is made and accepted in writing will not be eligible. Planning Permission, Listed Building Consent and other permissions might be required. These must all be in place prior to eligible work starting.

Payment of a grant is made on completion of work in compliance with grant conditions.

## Eligible work

The following are examples of types of work that may attract grant assistance where carried out using traditional materials and techniques subject to agreement:

- reroofing
- repair of chimneys (not removal)
- repair or replacement of gutters
- repair of stonework
- repair or reinstatement of sash and case windows
- reinstatement of shopfronts to an agreed pattern
- decoration where associated with eligible repair work

## Properties that may be eligible for assistance

Property must fall in a conservation area or be a listed building to be considered for assistance.

The Trust's focus for the period to March 2018 is supporting projects that help sustain or stimulate business activity or contribute towards improving the appearance of the business environment within the central core of the City Centre. (see below)





## Non-eligible work

The following are examples of types of work that are not eligible:

- running costs or maintenance such as clearing gutters, localised repointing or fixing slipped slates
- repair of modern windows, doors and shopfronts
- redecoration schemes
- alteration of properties (other than to reinstate them)
- interior repair or alteration
- provision of services (water, electricity or gas)
- use of materials or techniques that are not suitable for traditionally constructed buildings
- reinstatement of architectural features

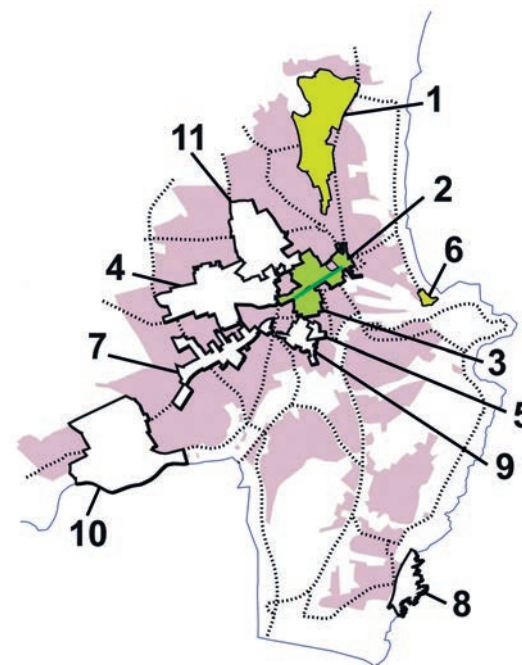
## Historic Area Regeneration Grant Priorities
